Public Spaces Protection Order

Inappropriate and inconsiderate Vehicle Use on Milton Park and Ride

South Cambridgeshire District Council 2025

Notice is hereby given that South Cambridgeshire District Council (the Council) has made the following Public Spaces Protection Order under section 59 of the Anti-Social Behaviour Policing and Crime Act 2014 (The Act).

This order shall come into effect on xxxxxxx and shall have an effect for 3 years thereafter, unless extended by further orders under the Council's statutory powers.

This order related to Milton Park and Ride edged red on the attached map (the Restriction Zone).

The Council are satisfied that the conditions set out in 59(2) of the Act have been met, namely that activities carried on in a public place within the authority's area have had a detrimental effect on the quality of life of those in the locality. These are – **Inappropriate and inconsiderate vehicle use causing vehicle related Anti-Social Behaviour.**

The Council is also satisfied that the conditions set out in Section 59(3) of the Act have been met. Namely, that the effect or likely effect of these activities is or is likely to be of a persistent or continuing nature and that these activities are unreasonable and justify the restrictions imposed by this order and that it is in all circumstances expedient to make this order for the purpose of reducing crime and/or anti-social behaviour in a public place.

1) Duration of the Order

This order comes into force on xxxx for a period of three years, unless extended by further orders under the council's statutory powers.

2) The restricted Area

Milton Park and Ride (map will go in of the area).

3) The Restrictions

A person may not carry out, assist, or encourage any of the activities below, at any time within the area covered by the Public Spaces Protection Order;

- a) Driving a motor vehicle at excessive speeds.
- b) Driving a motor vehicle in a manner that may cause harassment, alarm, or distress to other people in the vicinity.
- c) Driving a motor vehicle causing unnecessary and/or repeated acceleration and deceleration.
- d) Performing stunts in or on a motor vehicle (examples include, but not limited to; dough-nutting, handbrake turns, J-turns, drifting, wheel spinning/burnouts, wheelies).
- e) Repeatedly or continuously rev the engine of a motor vehicle unnecessarily while the vehicle is stationary.
- f) Unnecessarily sounding the horn of a motor vehicle.
- g) Playing amplified music in, near, or powered by a vehicle which can be heard at the boundary of the PSPO, or which is likely to cause a nuisance to others.
- h) Enter the PSPO in motor vehicles for the purpose of vehicle display or racing
- i) Using threatening/abusive/intimidating language or behaviour to other users of the Park & Ride within the area of the PSPO.

4) Definitions

- Public Space – for the purpose of the order is described above.
- Motor vehicles - for the purpose of this order is a motor vehicle as defined by the Road Traffic Act 1988.

- Vehicle horn – for the purpose of this order as defined by the Highway Code (latest edition), Road Traffic Act 1988 & Control of Pollution Act 1974 Part 3, Section 62 (2(a)).
- The responsible person for a breach of the order which has occurred under the terms of the paragraph 3)e) shall be either the person responsible for the offence or the registered keeper of the vehicle involved.

5. Offence of failing to comply with the order – Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 – Chapter 2 section 67

- It is an offense for a person without reasonable excuse to engage in any activity that is prohibited by this order.
- In accordance with Section 67 of the act, a person found to be in breach of this order is liable on summary conviction to a maximum penalty of a level 3 fine (up to £1000) or a Fixed Penalty Notice (FPN) of £xx.

Appeals

In accordance with section 66 of the Act, any interested person who wishes to challenge the validity of this order on the grounds that the council did not have the power to make the order or that a requirement under the Act has not been complied with may apply to the High Court within six weeks from the date upon which the order is made.
